On December 5, 2022, the Board of Education adopted modifications to Policy 9060 Rehabilitation Act of 1973: Compliance Section 504. The purpose of the modification was to update language, definitions, and references within the policy and to align with current best practices.

Additionally, on December 5, 2022, the Board of Education was provided modifications to Policy 9000 Student Residency, Eligibility, Enrollment, and Assignment. The implementation procedures were modified to refine the appeal process for parents requesting reassignment of students.

On January 12, 2023, the Board of Education was provided modifications to Policy 4000 Grants. The implementation procedures were modified to align with best practices and to clarify grant funds and equipment purchased with grant funds are the property of HCPSS until the end of their life cycle, as determined by HCPSS.

On February 9, 2023, the Board of Education adopted new Policy 9500 Educating Student Sex Offenders. The policy was developed in accordance with Maryland Annotated Code, Criminal Procedure Article, Section 11-722 that enables a registered sex offender who is a student to receive an education.

The changes are effective immediately. These policies and implementation procedures in their entirety can be accessed on [BoardDocs](#) and the [HCPSS website](#).
